- o Requesting \$3,000 for attorney fees to answer additional questions and prepare an SSA letter of agreement. When that request was brought to the Finance committee, some additional questions were answered. The Finance committee felt that after their previous dealings, we should not pursue the letter of agreement but should just get our questions answered first. Additionally, we have a \$2,000 credit with the attorney that was due to a billing error that the finance committee suggests we use for that. Bonnie's understanding is that the County will write the letter agreement once we commit in good faith to pursuing the SSA.
- There is confusion as to whether a letter of agreement obligates us to any expenses regarding an SSA or if it is just a written statement of understanding.
 - So it sounds like we need to get all the HLA parties involved and gather all the thoughts and questions about the SSA process before we dive into the SSA process.

New Business

New Class of Membership

- One of the ideas on the RIC Pay as you go proposal is to reduce the Road Improvement fee for members who only have a lot and no house.
- o Has it has been confirmed that this would be allowed by the CICAA? Not yet, but we believe so.
- o If we lose a membership only lot, we lose \$400 a year in revenue.
- o The benefit would be that this keeps people from dumping lots because of the additional assessments when they have less of a vested interest in the association.
- This would have to be a consideration as a change in the bylaws for the annual meeting, and approved before the members.
- Other considerations would be how this would impact voting rights.

Vice President Weir Arrived

Attorney Expenses for Road Improvement Committee - \$3,000

- Pirtle: Motion for Attorney expenses up to \$3,000 to obtain written documentation answering SSA related questions and gathering county expectations for what would be required for an SSA agreement.
- Second: Secretary Shake
 - Where will this come from?
 - We have \$2,000 credit with the attorney, so we would be dipping into the reserves for the other \$1,000.
 - This would fall out of next year's budget correct? Yes.
- Vote 4-0 motion passes.

Treasurer's report

Conservation Committee Report 12/15/15

- The Conservation Committee has not met since the October Board Meeting.
- Lake Draw Down: The drain valve has remained open continuously since Nov 7 and on Nov 21 reached a low point of 34 3/8 below normal pool. Rain since Nov 21 has raised the water level and it is currently at 21 3/8 below normal pool. The valve will remain open until the lake ices over.
- Overflow Pipe Liner: Maurer-Stutz Engineering on Nov 10 notified the DNR that their analysis showed
 that the dam meets DNR emergency overflow capacity requirements. The DNR has notified us that they
 are way behind in their work load and will review the request as soon as their priorities allow.
- Reclamation of the Lake North Inlet: Remains on hold.
- North Sediment Basin Clean Out: Basin clean out is ready to start.
